This week will be filled with Safety Videos, Helmet Fitting Lessons, and a special BMX Trick Bike Show for the entire school. All activities will take place during the school day. We ask for your support with

any assignments that are sent home to help keep our Huskies safe on the road!

**PARENTS:** Pre-K and Kindergarten Huskies will get to watch First through Fourth Graders participate in the Hyerville Bike Rodeo on Friday! Please help ensure your cowboys and cowgirls are ready for their Rodeo ride.

#### Thursday 10/19: Earn Your Hyerville Biker License


Huskies will take a Hyerville safety "exam" in class to earn their Hyerville Biker License! They will come home with their License and Rodeo t-shirt.

#### Friday 10/20: Use your Hyerville Safety tips, and Walk & Ride to School

- Pre-K and K will watch the Rodeo; Grades 1 4 will ride in the Rodeo
- Wear your Bike Rodeo T-Shirt to school
- Be sure to attach your license to your bike/scooter
- Bikes should be parked in spots by grade/teacher (see map below)

**Parents MAY COME WATCH** the Rodeo. The **parent viewing area will be along the north side of COLGATE Ave**. Please stay on the sidewalk within the parent viewing area to avoid any collisions. We will have a designated photographer take photos of each class as students finish the course. We know it's tempting to hop on the course for a photo, but for the safety of everyone, we ask that parents stay on the sidewalk.



If it rains, our newly-licensed bikers will still have a chance to shine! The Rodeo will be rescheduled for Friday, November 10.



As cold and flu season gets closer, it is a good time to remind everyone of our district policies regarding illness. <u>Nurse Rather</u> is always happy to answer any questions regarding these policies!

From the Health Services page of the HPISD website ....

It is the goal of Highland Park ISD to provide an environment that is conducive to learning for all students and staff. Some communicable diseases or conditions may warrant exclusion from school to avoid exposing other students. If your student exhibits any of the following symptoms, please keep your student home until the child is free of the symptoms and has been satisfactorily treated.

- Temperature of 100 degrees or above
- Vomiting and/or diarrhea
- Persistent cough
- Rash
- Open, itchy or draining lesions

- Red, itchy, draining eyes
- Lice
- Untreated scabies
- Suffering from a reportable disease, as defined by the Texas Board of Health
- Undiagnosed scaly patched on the body or scalp.
- Your child must be free of fever (without Tylenol or Advil), vomiting, and/or diarrhea for 24 hours before they return to school. Also, newly prescribed antibiotics must be taken for 24 hours before returning to school.
