THURSDAY 11/11: BIKERS ED "EXAM" - Kahoot test, Biker License earned and sent home.



- Pull up to the front of the line to exit. Do NOT open your door and let your kids out before you reach the Dads. This isn't safe and slows down the process for everyone.

DECODING DYSLEXIA MEETING THURSDAY

"Dyslexia Changes - New Opportunities for Our Students"
Thursday, November 11th, 6:30pm in HPISD's Multi-Purpose Building
Special Event Hosted by Decoding Dyslexia Park Cities

Texas State Board of Education member Dr. Audrey Young will speak with parents about changes to dyslexia education in our state. As Vice-Chair of the Committee on Instruction, Dr. Young was instrumental in updating the Texas Dyslexia Handbook this summer. She also



serves as a Director of Student Support Services for students with IEPs and 504 Plans, and has a distinguished career spanning over 27 years in education.

Educators must follow the Dyslexia Handbook when evaluating, identifying, serving, and supporting students with dyslexia and related

disorders. It's very important for parents to understand how recent changes to the handbook will impact students in HPISD and across the state of Texas. All parents of students identified with, or suspected of having, dyslexia or a related disorder are invited to attend.
